At Aston Manor Academy, students benefit from a flexible curriculum that builds on what they understand and know already. We believe that exposure, not only to culture but also to situations in which many students might not have previous experiences of, is of paramount importance to ongoing successes. This then gradually widens students' experiences as they progress through school. It is an important step in providing rich and engaging learning across the curriculum as well as extracurricular activities.

A range of cultural capital experiences are included throughout the curriculum and enrichment days, to avoid elitism. Ofsted Chief inspector Amanda Spielman called cultural capital "a golden thread, woven through everything you do to teach children well".
