The Options timeline – your guide to the options process

- Wednesday 29th January: Our Options booklet will be emailed to parents and made available online. Other
 information will be available on the school website as well.
- **Wednesday 29**th **January**: Launch assembly for students on Options process.
- Wednesday 29th January 5.00pm: Options Presentation to Parents in school. It will last for approximately 45 minutes. It will give you an opportunity to ask questions about the process. Please complete and return the reply slip, if you intend on coming on the above evening. If you are unable to attend, an online version of the presentation will be made available.
- **Monday 3**rd **February to Friday 7**th **February:** In certain subjects, subject teachers/leaders will give information about their subjects in lessons (where applicable).
- Monday 3rd February: Options booklet launched on school website
- **Monday 10th February 2.10pm**: Options Subjects assembly. Certain subject leaders will present to students information about their subjects.
- **From Tuesday 11**th **February**: Students will complete an initial options form online via Microsoft Forms. This will influence what subjects are offered on the final timeline.
- Week beginning Monday 24th February: Students will be given FINAL options forms to be completed and returned to school by Friday 7th March for initial checking.
- **Thursday 20**th **March:** Year 8 Parents' Evening 4.00 6.30pm. Parents will need to speak to Senior Staff to check and approve final options choices.
- **April May:** Student re-opting where there are clashes and final options choices sent to parents.

- What subjects are they interested in and want to study further?

<u>Advice</u>

- Choose something that you enjoy you're going to be studying these subjects for the next 2 years (at least) – and if you enjoy it, you're more likely to do well.
- Choose something that you're good at if you're good at something, you're more likely to enjoy it, and keep yourself motivated.
- Talk to others about your decisions you have people around you that are there to support your decision making, and it's really useful to talk to them about your options (teachers, careers advisors, parents, carers, siblings, friends) they shouldn't make your decision for you, but can be a great source of advice and alternative perspectives.
- Research into your goals and ambitions if you know vaguely what you want to do as a career, what you want to study at university, or even what you want to do at A-Level, then you should research into this course/profession and ensure that you are taking the relevant GCSE subjects.
- Keep your options open if you aren't sure about what you want to do after your GCSEs, then choose subjects that will open doors for you, whatever you decide to do after school. A good balance of different subjects will keep future options open, give you a good overview, and will help you realise what you are best at for decisions later in your education.





DON'T:

<u>Advice</u>

- Choose something because your friends are although this may make your lessons more fun, having your friends around won't help you when you have to sit an exam in that subject. It's therefore important not to choose something simply because others around you are. It also means that when you see your friends outside of lessons, you'll have more to talk about, and you may even make new friends!
- Choose something because you like the teacher you may not have the same teacher next year, and without that teacher, will you still enjoy the subject? Teachers will leave schools, or may not teach you when you change year groups, so you should never base your decisions on the teacher.
- Choose something you don't like, because someone told you to it's great to get advice and support from other people, but it's also important that you are the one to make the final decision, as you're the one that will be studying the subject!
- Choose a subject because you think it'll be easy no subjects are easy, so don't pick a subject for this reason!





Succeeding in KS4

To be successful you need to...

- Work hard and display our AMA Character and Culture attributesthis is easy to do in subjects you enjoy and are interested in. You have developed so many 'soft' skills that you can apply to your learning.
- **Home learning** this is an important part of KS4; are there subjects you find easier to work on at home?
- Exams Exam technique will be very important. Many subjects now are exam based and you will have a lot of information to remember. You need to be able to revise and apply this in exams.
- Controlled assessment / coursework Some subjects have less exams, more coursework. Meeting deadlines and working independently is key.

Our Options Pathways

We have 3 different pathways

EBACC – this is our most **academic route** where students will choose a minimum of 2 GCSEs (humanity and language) and then have a choice of 2 other subjects GCSE or vocational.

Mixed – Students have a lot of variety in this pathway. They will have to choose a minimum of 1 GCSE (humanity or language) and then have a choice of 3 other subjects GCSE or vocational.

Vocational – Students study functional skills (numeracy & literacy), Asdan, Hospitality and then have a choice of 1 other subject.





What is the EBACC pathway?

- Some students, based on Primary Teacher assessments and for the EBACC route. This is the most academic route we offer.
- To do this you must study French and 1 Humanities subject (Geography or History).
- A lot of good universities expect this and the Government are driving for a lot of students to study this.
- However, your child does not have to do this route if you do not want them to.





GCSE vs Vocational

- GCSE Majority of GCSEs are now linear 100% exams, with little coursework except practical subjects.
- Vocational Mainly coursework/controlled assessment based but also have an exam element.

All qualifications are equal

Distinction* = 8/9

Distinction = 7

Merit = 5/6

Pass = 4





GCSE vs Vocational What about after KS4?

- Both GCSE's and BTEC/OCR nationals (vocational subjects) will lead onto courses at Sixth Form.
- All our GCSEs and VOCATIONAL courses are accepted by Colleges and Sixth Forms, majority can lead to A levels as well as other courses.
- YOU MUST A MINIMUM ACHIEVE GRADE 5s in ENGLISH AND MATHS for A levels, GRADE 4S for other college courses.
